MISSION POLICIES
LOUISIANA STATE ASSOCIATION
MISSION POLICIES

I. CONCERNING MISSIONARIES:

1. Each missionary recommended to the Churches of the Louisiana State Association for support must have an endorsement as a missionary from the church where he holds membership. Other churches may present supporting endorsements if they so desire.

2. Each missionary must subscribe to the principles and practices of the churches composing the Louisiana State Association.

3. Each missionary on salary shall receive two (2) weeks leave of absence from his field of labor annually. Monies received for services tendered during this period need not be reported on his salary.

4. Each missionary on salary shall report all money collected on the field as salary other than as stated above. Such reports are to be made monthly to the Secretary-Treasurer of Missions.

5. It is recommended that all missionaries make periodic reports to supporting churches relative to their labors and that an annual report be made to the association giving a summary of his years' service.

6. Classification: A. Missionary: One who is sent to a particular field of labor with the intent of organizing a New Testament Church. B. Missionary Pastor: A pastor who comes recommended for helpful support who is or will be working with a church already organized.

II. CONCERNING ENDORSING CHURCHES:

1. The endorsing church must submit the name of its missionary together with a summary of his experiences, education, and any other pertinent information to the Secretary-Treasurer of Missions at least 60 days prior to the annual meeting of the association.

2. Missionaries who desire a continued endorsement as missionary by the Churches of the Louisiana State Association must have their church endorsement renewed yearly.

3. Endorsing churches should take a strong lead in the financial support of the missionary whom they have recommended to the association. 4. Churches should inform the Secretary-Treasurer of Missions immediately when the endorsement of a missionary is withdrawn. In the event such a situation arises the Secretary-Treasurer will stop the salary from the "salaried" missionary and shall return monies sent for missionaries on "designated support" to the senders.

III. CONCERNING SECRETARY-TREASURER OF MISSIONS:

Section I: Corresponding Secretary of missions

Duties:

1. To assist secretary-treasurer of missions

2. To aid in corresponding with the churches of Louisiana State in preparing and sending monthly reports of Secretary-Treasurer of Missions.
3. Corresponding secretary of missions to be recommended as part of the Missionary Committee report to the messenger assembly.

Section II: Secretary-Treasurer of Missions

1. The Secretary-Treasurer of Missions and the Assistant Secretary of missions shall be recognized as such by reason of their respective particular services.
2. He shall attend all meetings of the Missionary Committee as a member ex officio.
3. His salary (if any) and all expenses incidental to the office of Secretary-Treasurer shall be paid from undesignated mission funds.
4. All designated money received by the Treasurer shall be disbursed as stipulated by the donor or, as in some cases, returned to the sender.
5. The Secretary-Treasurer shall report any serious problem concerning the mission field to the chairman of the Missionary Committee. (If a special meeting of the Missionary Committee need be called, the chairman shall call this meeting).
6. The Secretary-Treasurer shall make a monthly report to the churches composing the association giving a record of all receipts and disbursements made through his office.
7. The Secretary-Treasurer shall make an annual report to the messenger assembly and Missionary Committee giving a report of his office activities and his retrospective and perspective views of the mission field.
8. If unforeseen events make it impossible for the Secretary-Treasurer of Missions to perform his duties, the Assistant Secretary-Treasurer of Missions shall assume these duties until such time as new Secretary-Treasurer of Missions is elected.

IV. CONCERNING GENERAL POLICY:

1. All missionaries who receive the endorsement of this association must have local church endorsement.
2. All missionaries who have the endorsement of a Local New Testament Church shall be recognized as a missionary; however, the churches composing the Louisiana State Association reserves the right to endorse or not to endorse anyone presented for their consideration.
3. Each missionary presented for consideration shall be voted on individually.

V. CONCERNING MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

Section I: Standing Missionary Committee

1. Definition standing missionary committee will consist of five brethren within our state for the purpose to assist secretary-treasurer of missions in disbursement of funds in case of emergency needs or new mission works within the state.
2. Emergency defined as natural disasters, fire, flood.
3. New mission described as a new mission work formed prior to annual meeting. To assist with funds as requested by sponsoring church.

4. Standing missionary committee to be recommended by annual missionary committee to general assembly.

5. Secretary of treasurer of missions to disburse funds for purposes as stated in Articles V under section 1-4 by a two-thirds majority vote of standing missionary committee members.

Section II:

1. The Missionary Committee shall consist of one "Committeeman" from each of the churches cooperating in the Louisiana State Association. A quorum shall consist of a Committeeman from at least one-third of the churches listed in the latest Association Annual (Minute). (If a quorum is not present at the appointed time for the meeting the members present may set another time or hour for the meeting until a quorum is present).

2. It shall be the duty of this committee to act as an executive of the Association between sessions, to carry out the object of this Association.

3. The primary object of the Missionary Committee is to promote the mission Program of this Association. In so doing it shall make annual recommendations to the Association relative to the mission field., its staff and otherwise.

4. The Missionary Committee shall meet in annual session at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon immediately preceding the Annual Association.

5. The Missionary Committee shall elect such officers and committees as shall be necessary to efficiently carry on the work committed unto it.

6. This committee shall submit a complete and concise report of its work annually to the association.

VI. STATE MISSION PROJECT

1. Project funds must be requested by a church fellowshipping in the Louisiana State Association of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches.

2. Any mission, whose sending church is outside the state of Louisiana, must be recommended by a church from within the state of Louisiana.

3. Requested funds must be used for stated projects only.

4. (A) Monies received by the Secretary/Treasurer of Missions office, upon the completion of the stated project within the associational year, will be divided among the remaining projects. (B) If there is only one (1) project for the associational year, upon completion, the monies will be held in the general fund until the next annual session.

5. Salaries are not covered in the state mission project fund.

VII. CONCERNING AMENDMENTS

These articles may be changed or altered at any regular session of the Association providing such changes or alterations be presented in writing on the first day of the meeting and voted on at some subsequent session. They may be amended, altered or repealed by a two-thirds vote of messengers.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

1. We believe that love one for another as Jesus loves the believer manifests our discipleship, proves our love for God and symbolizes our authority as New Testament churches. Love is therefore the great commandment of the LORD Jesus Christ upon which all others are dependent (Matthew 22:35-40; John 13:34-35; John 15:12; I John 4:7-21; I John 5:1-3; Revelation 2:4-5).

2. We believe in the infallible, verbal inspiration of the whole Bible and that the Bible is the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice (Psalm 119:160; II Timothy 3:16-17).

3. We believe in the personal triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, equal in divine perfection (Matthew 28:19).

4. We believe in the Genesis account of creation (Genesis 1:2).

5. We believe that Satan is a fallen angel, the archenemy of God and man, the unholy god of this world, and that his destiny is the eternal lake of fire (Isaiah 14:12-15; Ezekiel 28:11-19; Matthew 25:41; II Corinthians 4:4; Ephesians 6:10-17; Revelations 20:10).

6. We believe in the virgin birth and sinless humanity of Jesus Christ (Matthew 1:18-20; II Corinthians 5:21; I Peter 2:22).

7. We believe in the deity of Jesus Christ (John 10:30; John 1:1, 14; II Corinthians 5:19).

8. We believe the Holy Spirit is the divine Administrator for Jesus Christ in His churches (Luke 24:49; John 14:16-17; Acts 1:4, 5, 8; Acts 2:1-4).

9. We believe that miraculous spiritual manifestation gifts were done away when the Bible was completed. Faith, Hope, and Love are the vital abiding Spiritual Gifts (I Corinthians chapter 12-14).

10. We believe that man was created in the image of God and lived in innocence until he fell by voluntary transgression from his sinless state, the remit being that all mankind are sinners (Genesis 1:26; Genesis 3:6-24; Romans 5:12, 19).

11. We believe that the suffering and death of Jesus Christ was substitutionary for all mankind and is efficacious only to those who believe (Isa. 53:6; Heb. 2:9; I Peter 2:24; I Peter 3:18; II Peter 3:9; 1 John 2:2).

12. We believe in the bodily resurrection and ascension of Christ and the bodily resurrection of His saints (Matt. 28:1-7; Acts 1:9-11; I Cor. 15:42-58; I Thess. 4:13-18).

13. We believe in the pre-millennial, personal, bodily return of Christ as the crowning event of the Gentile age. This event will include the resurrection of the righteous to eternal heaven, and the Millennium will be followed by the resurrection of the unrighteous unto eternal punishment in the lake of fire and that the righteous shall enter into the heaven age (John 14:1-6; I Thess. 4:13-18; II Thess. 2:8; Rev. 19; Rev. 20:4-6; Rev. 20:11-15; Rev. 21:8).

14. We believe that the depraved sinner is saved wholly by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and the requisites to regeneration are repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Luke 13:3-5; John 3:16-18; Acts 20:21; Rom. 6:23; Eph. 2:8,9), and that the Holy Spirit convicts sinners, regenerates, seals, secures, and indwells every believer (John 3:6, John 16:8,9; Rom. 8:9-11; 1 Cor. 6:19-20; Eph. 4:30; Titus 3:5)

15. We believe that all who trust Jesus Christ for salvation are eternally secure in Him and shall not perish (John 3:36, 5:24, 10:27-30; Rom. 8:35-39; Heb. 10:39; I Peter 1:5).

16. We believe that God deals with believers as His children, that He chastises the disobedient, and that He rewards the obedient (Matt. 16:27, 25:14-23; John 1:12; Heb. 12:5-11; II John 8; Rev. 22:12)

17. We believe that Jesus Christ established His church during His ministry on earth and that it is always a local, visible assembly of scripturally baptized believers in covenant relationship to carry out the Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ, and each church is an independent, self-governing body, and no other ecclesiastical body may exercise authority over it. We believe that Jesus Christ gave the Great Commission to the New Testament churches only, and that He promised the perpetuity of His churches (Matt. 4:18-22, 16:18, 28:19-20; Mark 1:14-20; John 1:35-51; Eph. 3:21).

18. We believe that there are two pictorial ordinances in the Lord's churches: Baptism and the Lord's Supper. Scriptural baptism is the immersion of penitent believers in water, administered by the authority of a New Testament Church in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Lord's Supper is a memorial ordinance restricted to the members of the church observing the ordinance (Matt. 28:19-20; Acts 8, 12, 38; Rom. 6:4; I Cor. 5:11-13, 11: 1-2, 11:17-20, 26).

19. We believe that there are two divinely appointed offices in a church, pastors and deacons, to be filled by men whose qualifications are set forth in Titus and I Timothy.

20. We believe that all associations, fellowships, and committees are, and properly should be, servants of, and under control of the churches. (Matt. 20:25-28).

21. We believe in freedom of worship without interference from the government and affirm our belief in civil obedience, unless the laws and regulations of civil government run contrary to the Holy Scriptures (Rom. 13:1-7; I Peter 2:13-15).

22. We believe the Bible definition of marriage is the union between a man and a woman (Gen. 2:21-24; Matt. 19:4-6; Mark 10:6-9; I Cor. 7:2-4; Eph. 5:22-31).

RULES OF ORDER

1. Each session of the body shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. Correspondence may be opened with other Missionary Baptist organizations, as such time and place, as may be deemed proper.
3. Visiting brethren may be invited to seats and may be invited to speak, but not to vote.
4. Without a second no motion shall be discussed and motions lost shall not be recorded unless ordered at the time.
5. Motions containing two or more points shall be divided at the request of any member voting.
6. Every member desiring to speak must rise and address the moderator. No one shall speak more than three times on any subject without the permission of the assembly.
7. The moderator shall be the judge of order. Any messenger may appeal from the moderator's decision.
8. All committees shall be nominated either by the moderator or some other member, subject, however, to the approval of the body.
9. These rules may be altered or amended at any regular meeting of the body, by a majority of the members present.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I. This is the Louisiana State Association of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches.

ARTICLE II. This Association is a voluntary cooperation of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches.

ARTICLE III. The object of this Association is to stimulate the interest of the Lord's people in all phases of the work enjoined in the Commission, such as Local, Interstate, and Foreign Missions, Christian Education, caring for the needy, especially for the orphans, and searching the ways and means of bringing about an observation of all things He commanded.

ARTICLE IV. The Association will meet annually the second Thursday and Friday in November or oftener, by means of messengers, each church electing three messengers and two alternates, and these, when assembled, shall constitute a working committee of the Association of Churches, whose duty it will be to search out means that will bring an end of the purpose of the Associated Churches as stands in Article III.

ARTICLE V. That all things be done in decency and order, we accord to our messengers the right to organize themselves by electing among themselves such officers and committees as may be necessary.

ARTICLE VI. The messengers of this Association of churches are required to keep a correct record of all their work and report same to the churches in form of printed minutes for their approval or rejection.

ARTICLE VII. This Association will supply her messengers with the necessary funds to defray expenses of all work ordered done by her.

ARTICLE VIII. This Association of churches will maintain a Missionary Committee who will carry out the instruction of the churches so named by the church in her associational letter.

ARTICLE IX. All missionaries endorsed and contributed to by the Association must first have the endorsement of the church in which they hold membership.

ARTICLE X. All missionaries working with the Association of churches will make quarterly reports of their work to the treasurer and the Missionary Committee, which reports will be their authority for issuing whatever funds they may have for them and in addition to their quarterly reports they will report annually to the body of messengers, these reports to be heard in connection with the committee report on State Missions.

ARTICLE XI. The Association of Churches invites, urges, all Regular Missionary Baptist Church to join us in our efforts, and each church so desiring should prepare a letter showing her standing and elect messengers to the next annual meeting, such churches to be admitted into the group by a majority vote of the Association.

ARTICLE XII. Messengers from at least one-third of the churches listed in the most recent yearbook of the Louisiana State Association of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches shall constitute a quorum, but if any time there is not a quorum, those present will appoint a time and place of next meeting and adjourn.

ARTICLE XIII. All officers and committees will be elected annually and will keep a correct record of all work done by them and to report to the body of messengers.

ARTICLE XIV. This Association of Churches will correspond with sister associations when she deems it expedient.

ARTICLE XV. All discussions and transactions of the body of messengers not otherwise provided for will be governed by current parliamentary laws.

ARTICLE XVI. This statement of principles and rules of decorum may be amended at any annual meeting provided the amendment is offered by one or more churches in connection with the Associational letter, such amendment to be made by a majority of the churches.

ARTICLE XVII. The King James Version Bible is recommended for use among English speaking churches of Louisiana, and for use in all meetings of the Louisiana State Association of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches.

STATE LADIES AUXILIARY CONSTITUTION STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

NAME

Article I. Name of this organization: State Ladies Auxiliary of the churches of the Louisiana State Association of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches.

DEFINITION

Article II. The State Auxiliary is the associated forces of the churches in the state represented by messengers of the Auxiliaries.

OBJECT

Article III. The purpose of the State Auxiliary is to encourage the spirit of Christian cooperation among auxiliaries of the state, to encourage in every church in the Louisiana State Association and to aid and inspire each local auxiliary to a greater effort in helping the church in their work of winning the lost to Christ. The annual meeting shall be held at the time and place selected by the messengers in the annual assembly.

WHO SHALL REPRESENT?

Article IV. This association of auxiliaries shall be composed of three (3) messengers from each local cooperating auxiliary affiliated with the Louisiana State Association of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches. There shall be no more than three (3) messengers per church, regardless of the number of circles, auxiliaries, or missions representing a particular church.

OFFICERS

Article V. The officers are: (1) President; (2) First Vice-President; (3) Second Vice-President; (4) Secretary; (5) Assistant Secretary; (6) Treasurer; (7) Assistant Treasurer; (8) Parliamentarian; (9) Assistant Parliamentarian; and (10) Advisory Council. All officers shall be elected at the annual meeting and shall serve until the next session. An officer shall not succeed herself more than once.

Each officer (and members of the Advisory Council) shall be an active member of a church affiliating with the Louisiana State Association of Regular Missionary Baptist Churches.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Article VI.

Section I. President: The duties of the President are (a) To preside over all State meetings; (b) To appoint committees as directed by the body; and (c) To be active in looking after the welfare of the work.

Section II. First Vice-President and Second Vice-President: The duties of the First Vice-President and Second Vice-President are (a) To preside over the meetings in the absence of the President; and (b) To perform all duties that evolve upon such officers.

Section III. Secretary and Assistant Secretary: The duties of the Secretary are (a) To keep a record of the proceedings of the meetings; (b) To give notice of special meetings; (c) Prepare and read reports; and (d) To perform all other duties that usually evolve upon such an officer. The duty of the Assistant Secretary is to assist the Secretary in the performance of her duties.

Section IV. Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer: The duties of the Treasurer are (a) To receive and disburse all funds at the direction of the messenger body; and (b) To record and report same at annual meetings. The duty of the Assistant Treasurer is to assist the Treasurer in the performance of her duties.

Section V. Parliamentarian and Assistant Parliamentarian: The duty of the Parliamentarian is to assist the presiding officer in keeping the meeting in parliamentary order. The duty of the assistant Parliamentarian is to assist the Parliamentarian in the performance of her duties.

Section VI. Advisory Council: The Advisory Council will advise in matters pertaining to doctrine and when called upon by the presiding officer for advice.

REGULAR MEETINGS

Article VII. This organization shall meet the day of the annual meeting of the Louisiana State Association of Missionary Baptists.

COMMITTEES

Article VIII. At each annual meeting of her auxiliary the President appoints such committees as the body deems necessary and gives their report at the same annual session.

AMENDMENTS

Article IX. The articles of Agreement shall not be changed or amended except by a two-thirds majority vote at any regular meeting.

RULES OF DECORUM FOR MESSENGER ASSEMBLY

1. Every assembly shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. Visiting brethren from all churches of like faith and order may be invited to council with us, but not to vote.
3. Any person wishing to speak must rise to his feet and be recognized by the Moderator, and no one who is in order shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject or uses personal reflections.
4. No one may speak more than twice on the same subject without permission of the assembly, except to clarify some point in the discussion.
5. All motions and amendments to motions must be seconded before they are entertained by the Moderator and then opened for discussion. The mover may at any time, with the consent of the one who seconded, withdraw the motion.
6. Nominations shall be from the floor and may be made by any messenger.
7. All questions shall be decided by a vote of the majority of the messengers.
8. The Moderator shall have the same privilege of speech as any person, provided the chair be filled, and also in the case of a tie, may give the deciding vote.
9. Any messenger, not satisfied with the decision of the Moderator, may appeal to the assembly, provided it be done during the same session in which the decision is made.
10. The messengers will address each other by the title of “brother” or “sister.”

Thank you for the opportunity to share God's blessings this past year from Glenwood Baptist Youth Camp. Total attendance for the year was 945, with 42 professions of faith and 3 young men surrendered to ministry. God was good to us again!

CHANGES

In 1968, Glenwood Baptist Youth Camp was established with land donated by the Raines family. Through the years churches have brought their young people to enjoy a week of camp during the summer. For many years the camp was only utilized during the summer months. As time went by, it became apparent that operating only during the summer was not financially viable. This year the decision was made to begin aggressively marketing our camp as a "Christian Camp and Conference Center." While our primary focus will still be summer youth camps, we want people to know that our facility can be used by senior groups, women's and men's conferences, association meetings and much more.

Thank you to Bro. Brandon Jones for helping us with a new logo that reflects this new approach.

GROUNDS

During the year we upgraded our children's playground with a new play area and new playground equipment. The little ones and their parents really enjoyed this addition. Also, we received 15 new picnic tables that were distributed throughout the grounds. A new volleyball court along with road improvements made the camp a better place to bring young people and adults for a time of fellowship and worship.

A new water heater in the kitchen was installed during the spring. The previous water heater was a residential unit that just could not keep up with the demand. When it failed, we replaced it with a propane powered tankless system that is commercially rated and used by many restaurants in the area. This proved to be a good decision.

Our mattress and bed project is coming along nicely. All of the boy's dorms have new wooden beds and new mattresses. We are now beginning to work on the girl's dorms. Already 16 single beds for adult sponsors and 4 bunk beds have been placed in the girl's dorms. This will be a great improvement for our campers.

Keep us in your prayers as we continue to make improvements.

FINANCES

While we are not requesting state funds for the coming year, the need is still great and your assistance is needed.

The profit and loss statement shows an increase of \$13,523.24 for the year. With

this increase we were able to pay off a line of credit that was taken out several years ago when we were running deficits. By paying off this line we are saving approximately \$500.00 per month. Regular offerings only pay the monthly bills, any improvements must come from special offerings.

We continue to work diligently to be good stewards of the Lord’s money and operating this camp in as an efficient manner as possible. Please keep us in your prayers.
